### **SECTION - A**

- 1. (i) The most significant thing mentioned in the passage is the fact 80 percent mothers cradle their infants in their left arms holding them against the left side of their bodies.
  - (ii) It emerges that 83 percent of right handed mothers hold the baby on the left side but then so do 78 percent of left handed mothers. In other words only 22 percent of the left handed mothers have their dominant hands free for actions.
  - (iii) The sound of heart beat has claiming effect on an infant. Groups of New Born babies exposed to sound of heartbeat cry less and gain more weight. Those listening to heartbeat fell asleep quickly.

- 2. (i) By next year 2022 the world may experience extreme climatic changes like ice loss at the Arctic's, heat waves in many parts of the world, forest fire and extreme of temperatures.
  - (ii) Inger Andersen is UNEP's Executive Director and he observed that the year 2020 is on course to be one of the warmest on record while wildfires storms and droughts continue to weak havoc.
  - (iii) Under the global warming pact,+ Nations have committed to a long term goal of limiting the average temperature rise to below 2 degrees Celsius above preindustrial levels and to peruse efforts to limit it even further to 1.5°celsius.
  - (iv) The gap between anticipated emissions and those consistent with limiting the global temperature rise is known as emission gap.
  - (v) Emissions have grown by an average 1.4 percent per year since 2010 with a steeper increase of 2.6 percent last year partly due to a large increase in forest fires.
  - (vi) Because of the coronavirus pandemic, there was drop in travel, industrial activity and electricity generation which brought the reduction in emission.
  - (vii) The resulting drop in travel, industrial activity and electricity generation are likely to work out at a 7% reduction in emission, the report said. That translates to only a 0.01 C reduction in global warming by 2050. This proves that development has an adverse effect on our environment.

- In the story The Rattrap the peddler sells small rattraps made of wire. He believed that the world existed for no other purpose but to set baits for people. The world was full of riches and joys, shelter and food, just as the rattrap offered food. When anyone was tempted to touch the bait, it trapped him, and it brought everything to an end. Thus, the metaphor of the rattrap serves quite aptly to highlight the human predicament. The more we are allured by the wordly things, the more we are entrapped by them. There is no way out because the more you want, the less you have.
